Multi-stakeholder Partnerships in Early Stage Project Development in the Municipal Waste Sector in Mozambique

Side – Event: Wednesday 9th December at 14:00 – 15:30 in Salle 2 of the Africa Pavilion

Abstract

One of the most important challenges for low carbon development in Africa is the relative inability of project developers to take their projects beyond the concept level or pilot phase. This so-called “early stage valley of death” has a number of causes, including the immature nature of policy frameworks and the elevated learning cost of doing everything for the first time. Third-party financing for early stage project development remains almost non-existent causing an “early-stage financing gap” which has become a critical market failure that the private sector has been unable to resolve on its own. This side event will present lessons learnt from an early stage project development initiative in the municipal waste sector in Mozambique involving several stakeholders. The lessons learnt and experiences will be relevant for the discussions on the engagement of different stakeholders and on how to structure and finance early stage project preparation facilities in Africa.
